Motion was made by Leslie Wynn to pass Resolution No 18.7, seconded by Brenda Cano, All in favor, motion passed.

Consideration and possible action in regard to Resolution 18-9 Authorizing and Directing the San Antonio River Authority (SARA) to Apply on Behalf of the City of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TWPD) for the Local Park Non-Urban Outdoor Recreation Grant 2018 for the Escondido Creek Parkway Project; and Authorizing the City Manager to Execute Any and All Documents Necessary.

18. Consideration and possible action to appoint one City Official to a three (3) person committee to score CDBG grant applications and make a recommendation to City Council.

A motion was made to appoint Brandon Briones to a 3 person committee to score DBG grant applications by Leslie Wynn, Seconded by Brandon Briones, all in favor, motion passed.

### 19. Consideration and possible action in regard to the Contract for Hotel Occupancy Tax Expenditures.

A motion was made to table this item by Leslie Wynn, seconded by Brandon Briones. All in favor motion passed.

The discussion then continued and Brenda Cano and Alberto Baldaramos rescinded their vote.

A motion was then made by Brenda Cano to pull off the table, seconded by Alberto Baldaramos, Leslie Wynn voted no, Justin yes, Brandon yes. Motion passed.

A motion was then made by Brenda Cano to send the Chamber a 90 day notice of termination, seconded by Alberto Baldaramos. Brandon Briones voted yes, Leslie Wynn and Justin Meyer voted no. Motion passed.

Consideration and possible action in regard to purchasing and programming thirty(30) G% P25 dual band pagers for the Kenedy Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD) with a purchase price of \$695.00 per unit, and a program cost \$45.00 per unit, with an extended discount of \$3,000 for the order for a total purchase price of \$19,200.
