Total	\$1650.00


If we want to add the fireworks the cost would be aprx \$12,000 for a total of aprx \$14,000.


We would use on duty resources for parking, crowd control, trash pick up and water distribution.



STATEMENT OF PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

Based on the project description and goals as stated in the Request for Qualifications due April, 9 2021, The City of Kenedy seeks professional architectural and engineering services pertaining to the planning, design and construction of a multipurpose convention center.

Initially, The City will require a survey of the site, a study of existing conditions, and conceptual design to determine the project scope and to provide data for a preliminary cost estimate. Upon completion of this initial study, The City will determine if the project is to proceed.

If the project is approved, the architect will begin the programming process and continue developing the plans and design of the Convention Center that represents the best value for The City of Kenedy. Frequent communication, regular progress meetings and presentations will ensure the project is developing in accordance with the specific goals and intent of City administrators and stakeholders.

The design phases will culminate in the completion of the construction documents which will be used for bidding and construction. The City will require the architect to facilitate bidding and contract negotiations with the selected general contractor.

During construction, the architect will provide comprehensive construction management services. Regular site visits and progress conferences will be required to ensure adherence to the project timeline, and construction documents. Review of pay applications, RFIs and Submittals will be completed in a timely manner and will continue throughout construction.

Upon completion the architect will facilitate a final walkthrough and oversee the submission of closeout documents and as-built drawings. A postproject review will be performed at the end of year one to assess any warranty issues.

In 2017 The City Port Lavaca's Bauer Community Center sustained significant hurricane damage and was in need of repair. To coincide with the repairs The City decided to renovate and modernize the facility to better serve the needs of the local community.

Interior spaces including the main hall, lobby, kitchen, restrooms and staff offices were completely renovated with updated finishes and materials. Sound rated partitions were added to provide smaller rentable conference spaces and to accomodate multiple events simultaneously.

The exterior repairs and roof replacement were funded through FEMA grants. RMA provided all documentation and design to align with requirements for Federally funded projects.

The project goal was to create facilities to fulfill the needs of the economic growth of the Victoria region by focusing on three economic areas: entertainment, hospitality and athletics. Each facility was designed to meet its specific economic requirements as an independent facility and in conjunction with the entire complex.

The facility was designed to be efficiently reconfigured for entertainment and athletic functions. A combination of fixed and mobile seating was designed to accomodate up to 8,500 people for concerts, rodeos, basketball, volleyball, hockey, and livestock shows.

The Conference Center was designed as a flexible one story space for hosting large conference events. It featured a large, contiguous single level exhibit space divisible into four separate halls via configurable partitions. The Conference Center was designed to accomodate professional conferences and conventions, trade shows, civic vents, catered functions, and live animal events.

The complex also featured large, open-bay support buildings with small office areas for management and maintenance personnel. Support buildings were intended to house animals during livestock events and provide storage for Event and Conference Center equipment.

Other features planned for the site included an onsite hotel, baseball and soccer stadiums, public pool and gardens, and a golf course.
